As we begin our year together as congregation and Interim Rabbi, this past month has certainly been a busy and adventurous time for Fran and me. Moving from the Chicago area which is really "home base" for us, to a part of the country in which we have never lived, has been a huge change for us. The change brought about by

moving to a new part of the country and a new community can be exciting, scary, challenging, confusing, and invigorating, all at the same time. But slowly we have settled into our new home, learned some of the 99 ways one can take to get from here to there, and most importantly, begun to get to know the Temple and its members. Our experience at TBA has been warm and welcoming, a wonderful reflection, not only of the particular individuals we have met, but of the tone and culture of the congregation as a whole. 

BACK TO SCHOOL

Here we are edging towards the beginning of the school year. The hallways are still quiet and the pace is still a bit slower. However, despite the quiet and slow pace we are hard at



work preparing for next year. There are class lists to be made, supplies to be ordered, cleaning to be done, curriculum to be reviewed, and of course we are also preparing for opening day as well new projects for the coming year.


